# Strategy for the Conduct of Parliamentary Elections 2013: National Assembly

#### INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

## 1. Legal Provisions related to Term of Office

1.1. Section 24 of Article 10 of the Constitution provides that:

"The National Assembly and the National Council shall continue for five years from the date of the first sitting of the respective Houses. While the National Council shall complete its five-year term, premature dissolution of the National Assembly may take place on the recommendation of the Prime Minister to the Druk Gyalpo or in the event of a motion of no confidence vote against the Government being passed in the National Assembly or in accordance with section 12 of Article 15."

1.2. Section 37 of Chapter 6 of the National Assembly Act 2008 provides that:

"At the first sitting after any general election, or when necessary to fill a vacancy, the NA shall elect a Speaker and Deputy Speaker from among its members"

- 1.3. The date of the First Sitting of the National Assembly, based on the election of the Speaker and Deputy Speaker, is 21<sup>st</sup> of April 2008.
- 1.4. The term of office, being five years from the date of the First Sitting of the House, is from 21<sup>st</sup> of April 2008 to 20<sup>th</sup> of April 2013.

### 2. Legal Provisions related to Elections

2.1. Section 5 of Article 24 of the Constitution provides that:

"Parliament shall, by law, ensure that the Election Commission holds elections so that the National Assembly and Local Governments are reconstituted within ninety days after its dissolution.

"Provided that in the case of the National Council, elections shall be held so that it is re-constituted on the date of expiry of the term. In the case of the Dzongkhag Tshogdu..."

2.2. National Assembly Elections are to be held for constituting a new National Assembly whenever the duration of the existing National Assembly expires or it is prematurely dissolved.

## 3. National Assembly Elections 2013

- 3.1. The National Assembly Elections 2013, under the Constitution and Electoral laws, comprises elections to the National Assembly through two rounds of elections namely the Primary Round and the General Elections.
- 3.2. His Majesty The King of Bhutan was Pleased to Issue The Royal Decree, Calling the National Assembly Elections on 20<sup>th</sup> of April 2013, with the Primary Round Poll Day on 31<sup>st</sup> of May 2013 and General Elections Poll Day on 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.
- 3.3. Election Commission of Bhutan issued the Notification on the Election Schedule on **29**<sup>th</sup> of April **2013**.
- 3.4. The Result Counting shall be done on the same day with the Results Declaration on the day after the Poll Days.

## 4. National Assembly Demkhongs

- 4.1. The National Assembly Elections shall be conducted in the *Forty Seven* National Assembly *Demkhongs*, the territorial boundaries of which had been notified by the Final Delimitation Order issued for the National Assembly *Demkhongs* vide Order No. DC/CHAIR/2007/637 dated 26<sup>th</sup> March 2007 and the revised spellings as notified vide Order No. DC/CHAIR/2013/2894 dated 10<sup>th</sup> of April 2013.
- 4.2. The National Assembly *Demkhongs* are as follows:

### PREPARATIONS FOR THE PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS 2013

## 5. Preparatory Activities

- 5.1. The preparations for the Second Parliamentary Elections 2013 were guided principally by the Work Plan and Calendar of Events detailing the various activities, as drawn up at the 3rd ECB Conference in Tsirang in April 2012.
- 5.2. The main groups of preparatory activities for the National Assembly Elections are same as those detailed out in the *Strategy for the Conduct of Parliamentary Elections 2013: National Council*, including those related to the:
  - 5.2.1. Electoral Roll Revisions for the Parliamentary Elections 2013 as well as the intensive and summary revisions and the claims and objections for the National Assembly Elections between 8<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> of April 2013;
  - 5.2.2. Biometric piloting;
  - 5.2.3. Review of Polling Stations;
  - 5.2.4. Voter Education and Electoral Training;
  - 5.2.5. Revision of Handbooks, Rules, Forms, Guidelines;
  - 5.2.6. Political Party/ Candidate related; and
  - 5.2.7. SMS-based election result and voter turn-out reporting.

#### INTERIM GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

#### 6. Interim Government

- 6.1. Under Section 1 of Article 19 of the Constitution, an Interim Government shall be appointed by the Druk Gyalpo to enable the Election Commission to hold free and fair elections.
- 6.2. The Appointment of the Interim Government was Commanded by Royal Decree issued on **28**<sup>th</sup> **of April 2013**.

### 7. Local Governments

- 7.1. The Dzongdags of the twenty Dzongkhags, Executive Secretaries of the *Dzongkhag Thromdes* and the Gewog Administrative Officers (GAOs) in the Gewogs shall serve as the Focal Points for all administrative matters related to elections in the Dzongkhags, *Thromdes* and Gewogs respectively during the Election Period.
- 7.2. The Dzongdags, Executive Secretaries and the GAOs shall be responsible in ensuring that their respective jurisdictions are conducive and congenial for the conduct of free and fair Parliamentary Elections 2013 and fulfill the duties as detailed in the *Handbook for Election Coordinators* and respective Appointment Orders.

## 8. Role of *Midhey Gothrips*

- 8.1. The *Midhey Gothrips*, including the *Dzongkhag Tshogdu* and *Gewog Tshogde* members, in the respective Dzongkhags may inform and educate members of the public on the importance of turning out to vote on the days of poll.
- 8.2. The *Midhey Gothrips* shall not participate, directly or indirectly, or give grounds to reasonably construe support, opposition or dislike of any Candidate contesting the elections.
- 8.3. The *Midhey Gothrips* may be required, in specific cases, to assist in the logistical arrangements for the conduct of elections or during the dispute investigations but they shall not be present in the Polling Stations on the Poll Days except to cast their votes.

#### REMAINING ABOVE POLITICS AND APOLITICAL

## 9. Religion, Religious Personalities and Religious Organisations

- 9.1. Under Section 3 of Article 3 of the Constitution, Section 5 of the Religious Organisations Act and Section 184 of the Election Act, religion and religious personalities shall remain above politics, neither engaging in any activities that are directly related to public elections nor being involved in any political activity.
- 9.2. Religious Personalities and/or Religious Organisations shall not participate, directly or indirectly, or give grounds to reasonably construe support, opposition or dislike of any Candidate contesting the elections.
- 9.3. The Election Commission, vide its Notification No. ECB/CEC-Notif/2012/425 dated 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2012, notified of the prohibition of the conduct of religious events involving public gathering starting from 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2013 until the completion of the Election Period.
- 9.4. Further, during the Election Period, even private religious events particularly the wrathful practices and rituals such as *tordog*, *torphang* etc. will be prohibited in particular by the candidates, leaders and/or their representatives and supporters.
- 9.5. Religious Personalities shall neither vote in the elections nor participate, directly or indirectly, or give grounds to reasonably construe support, opposition or dislike of any Candidate contesting the elections.

### 10. Civil Servants

- 10.1. Section 1 of Article 26 of the Constitution provides for "an independent and apolitical civil service".
- 10.2. The Civil Service Act of Bhutan, under Section 38, specifies that a civil servant shall not (a) be eligible to be a candidate for any election conducted under the electoral laws of the Kingdom or hold any paid or unpaid post in any political party; (b) canvass for the political party or any candidate in an election conducted under the electoral laws of the Kingdom. Further, Section 97.2 defines "Apolitical" as meaning not being linked with political parties or engaged in any political activities.
- 10.3. The civil servants shall cast their votes either in person at the designated Polling Stations or by Postal Ballot. However, no civil servant shall participate, directly

- or indirectly, or give grounds to reasonably construe support, opposition or dislike of any Candidate contesting the elections.
- 10.4. Specifically, the civil servants shall not attend any campaign events, meetings, *Zomdus*, etc. as they will have ample access to information on the Candidates contesting the elections through the various State financed campaign materials and mass media communications except for those civil servants on election duty required to observe or monitor such events.

## 11. Civil Society Organisations/Non-Governmental Organisations

- 11.1. Under Section 7 of the Civil Society Organisation Act 2007, the CSOs are required to refrain and neither engage in any activities directly related to public elections nor be involved in political activity.
- 11.2. Accordingly, no NGOs or CSOs shall participate, directly or indirectly, or give grounds to reasonably construe support, opposition or dislike of any Candidate contesting the elections.

## THE ELECTION SCHEDULE

## 12. Election Schedule

12.1. The Schedule of dates and time for the National Assembly Elections 2013 shall, as notified to the general public vide ECB/Notif-01/2013/3403 dated 29<sup>th</sup> of April 2013, is as presented in Table 1 below:

#### **ELECTION OFFICIALS**

#### 13. Media Arbitrator

- 13.1. The senior and competent Officer from the public service appointed as the Media Arbitrator for the National Council Elections 2013 by the Election Commission shall be re-appointed to continue in the post and serve for the National Assembly Elections 2013. He is vested with the authority and have the responsibility to fulfill the roles and responsibilities as provided in the Electoral Laws, rules, regulations and the Appointment Order.
- 13.2. The Media Unit, headed by the Spokesperson for the Commission, shall provide all necessary support to the Media Arbitrator.
- 13.3. The Media Arbitrator's Office shall have the capacity to monitor as well as handle social media disputes besides the other media related responsibilities.

#### 14. Chief Election Coordinators

- 14.1. The Dzongdags of the respective Dzongkhags shall continue to serve as the Chief Election Coordinators, responsible to ensure the participation of the electorate and coordination of different electoral stakeholders for conduct of free and fair elections and for carrying out the roles, responsibilities and duties in their respective areas as provided in the Electoral Laws and elaborated in the Appointment Orders.
- 14.2. The Dzongrabs/ *Dungpas*/ Executive Secretaries of the *Dzongkhag Thromdes* shall continue to serve as the Deputy Chief Election Coordinators and Gewog Administrative Officers (GAOs) as the Assistant Chief Election Coordinators to assist the Chief Election Coordinator in the respective Dzongkhag, Dungkhag, Thromdes and Gewogs.

#### 15. National Observers

15.1. The Election Commission shall appoint 47 National Observers, one in each of the 47 *National Assembly Demkhongs*. The 20 National Observers and 27 Micro Observers appointed for the National Council Elections shall continue to serve in the respective places of posting for the National Assembly Elections as the National Observers of the 47 *Demkhongs* unless otherwise appointed by the Election Commission.

- 15.2. A Committee of ECB Officers chaired by the Director of the ECB shall select and recommend the officials to be appointed as National Observers for appointment by the Chief Election Commissioner.
- 15.3. The Observers shall be responsible to exercise the authority, roles and responsibilities of a National Observer fully as provided in the Electoral Laws, rules, regulations and, in particular, the *Guidelines for Election Observation of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012 and the Appointment Orders.
- 15.4. The National Observers shall be fully accountable to observe and report on the election procedures and Election Code of Conduct being followed and abided by all responsible or involved in the electoral process.
- 15.5. An Observer must refrain from undertaking any duty or responsibility that is not legally assigned to the post under the Laws or Orders.
- 15.6. An Observer shall refrain from interfering/advising/executing any tasks other than those specifically mandated in their respective appointment orders.
- 15.7. An Observer shall record observations, including on the Poll Day, and submit the required Reports promptly as per the Format in **Annexure 1.**

## 16. Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers

- 16.1. The Election Commission shall appoint 47 Returning Officers, one in each of the 47 National Assembly Demkhongs. The 20 Returning Officers and 27 Assistant Returning Officers who were appointed for the National Council Elections shall continue to serve in the respective places of posting for the National Assembly Elections as the Returning Officers of the 47 Demkhongs unless otherwise appointed by the Election Commission.
- 16.2. 6 Assistant Returning Officers, one each in in *Sombaykha Demkhong* of Haa Dzongkhag, *Kengkhar\_Weringla Demkhong* of Monggar Dzongkhag, *Lhamoi Dzingkha\_Tashiding Demkhong* of Dagana Dzongkhag and *Jomotshangkha\_Martshala Demkhong* of Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhag shall be appointed by the Election Commission to assist the respective Returning Officers of these 4 *Demkhongs*, one in the Permanent Mission of Bhutan, New York and one in ECB Head Office to efficiently handle the postal ballots of the overseas Postal Voters other than the United States of America and remote areas in the country.

- 16.3. A Committee of ECB Officers chaired by the Director of the ECB shall select and recommend the officials to be appointed as Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers by the Chief Election Commissioner.
- 16.4. The Returning Officer shall be the overall-supervisor in the actual conduct of elections in the respective *Demkhongs*.
- 16.5. A Returning or Assistant Returning Officer shall be vested with the authority, roles and responsibilities and fully accountable as per the provisions in the Electoral Laws, Rules, Regulations, *Handbook for Returning Officers*, and the Appointment Order issued by the Election Commission.
- 16.6. The Office of the Returning Officer shall be located outside the Dzong and in an accessible and convenient site. Similarly, the venue of the election events shall be, as far as possible, at locations that do not require the wearing of the *kabney* and *pata*.

## 17. Presiding & Polling Officers

- 17.1. Returning Officers shall be responsible to appoint the Presiding and Polling Officers selected, in consultation with the respective Election Coordinators, from amongst dependable and competent government officials from those working within the same Dzongkhag, if available.
- 17.2. A Returning Officer shall ensure that Presiding and Polling Officers are appointed or their place of duty designated taking into account the minimum travel time required to reach the respective Polling Station but not earlier than three days before the day of Poll i.e. not before 27<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 in case of the Primary Round and not before 9<sup>th</sup> of July 2013 in case of the unless otherwise required by the Election Commission.
- 17.3. A Presiding or Polling Officer shall be vested with the authority, roles and responsibilities and fully accountable as per the provisions in the Electoral Laws, rules, regulations and the *Handbooks for Presiding and Polling Officers*.
- 17.4. A Presiding Officer will be the overall in-charge of a Polling Station.
- 17.5. A Presiding Officer will be assisted by a team of Polling Officers in ensuring smooth polling at the Polling Station.

### 18. Counting Supervisors & Counting Assistants

- 18.1. The Returning Officers shall authorize the Presiding Officer and a Polling Officer in a Polling Station to function as the Counting Supervisor and the Counting Assistant to count the results after the close of Poll.
- 18.2. Counting Supervisors shall be vested with the authority, roles and responsibilities as per the provisions in the Electoral Laws, rules, regulations and the *Handbook for Counting Supervisor* and Counting Assistants.

## 19. Authorization to Record Evidence

19.1. In particular the general public shall be notified and made aware that election officials are authorized to photograph, videograph or otherwise record all and any election event which may be used as legal evidence in an election dispute.

## 20. Assignment of Duty Stations

20.1. An officer considered for appointment as a National Observer, Micro-Observer, Returning Officer, Assistant Returning Officer, Presiding Officer, Polling Officer, Counting Supervisor or Counting Assistant must point out to the authority concerned in case he/she is being placed in the *Dzongkhag* where his/her *Gung* or *Mitsi* is registered for appropriate action.

## 21. Number of Election Officials to be Appointed

21.1. The deployment of Election Officials for the National Assembly Elections shall be as in **Table 2** below:

## 22. Declaration of Conflict of Interest

22.1. An Election Official shall declare any relationship that could lead to an actual or perceived conflict of interest with his/her duties as an Election Officer and a decision taken thereof by the appointing authority shall be valid.

## 23. Dzongkhag Election Officers

23.1. The Dzongkhag Election Office and its officers shall be responsible to assist and advice the respective Chief Election Coordinators and Returning Officers and backstop the Election and Polling officials in the conduct of the Elections.

#### **SECURITY**

### 24. Security Personnel

- 24.1. The Royal Bhutan Police (RBP) shall be responsible to provide security to places and personnel on election duty during the Parliamentary Elections 2013 particularly at every polling station as per the *Election Security Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012.
- 24.2. The RBP in consultation with the Dzongkhag/ Gewog authorities shall carry out an assessment of the security threat level of each Polling Station and determine the required level of security personnel including deployment of female personnel required to frisk female voters.
- 24.3. The RBP may consider deploying the Volunteer Community Police Force for the frisking duty at Polling Stations.
- 24.4. The RBP shall be responsible for liaising with the Royal Bhutan Army (RBA) towards provision of adequate security for the safe conduct of the Elections.
- 24.5. The RBP shall designate one senior officer as the Election Security Coordinator to liaise between the RBP, RBA and the Election Commission of Bhutan.
- 24.6. The Security Coordinator in each Dzongkhag shall be responsible to participate in the Coordination Meetings held in each Dzongkhag and provide security support as may be found necessary for the entire election period for election places and officials.
- 24.7. The Security Coordinator shall make a courtesy call on the Chief Election Coordinator on arrival at the place of his/her appointment.
- 24.8. Security shall be given particular emphasis during the Common Forum, Public Debates, dispute resolution, 48 hours reflection time before the Polls, Poll Day and Result Declaration.
  - If and when necessary, the RBP shall have the authority and power to detain any person found responsible for creating trouble or disturbance that is reasonably concluded to undermine the safety and security of conduct of an electoral event exercising the power and authority provided under Section 38 of the Election Act.

- 24.9. The RBP shall assess and consider provision of adequate security of the ECB Offices, both Head Office as well as the Dzongkhag Offices, to ensure that no untoward incidents occur to compromise the integrity or hamper the smooth operations of the elections.
- 24.10. An officer/personnel of the RBP or RBA considered for election security duty must point out to the authority concerned in case he/she is being deployed in the *Dzongkhag* where his/her *Gung* or *Mitsi* is registered for appropriate action.

## 25. Security Coordination and Searches

- 25.1. The Election Security Officers of a *Dzongkhag* shall work in close coordination and cooperation with the election officers as a team towards conducting the elections smoothly.
- 25.2. The local administration or election security personnel must deal appropriately and reasonably with any sign or incidence of potential for violence or disruption at a polling station, place of counting etc. by any individual or group, and the Commission intimated immediately for further advice and direction.
- 25.3. Party Leaders/Candidates/Supporters and persons not belonging or ordinarily residing in a *Demkhong* should move out of the *Demkhong* at the end of the Campaign Period and before the Poll Day unless otherwise authorized by the Election Commission.
- 25.4. The Returning Officer must in collaboration with the election security personnel conduct surprise joint inspections of persons, vehicles and properties at entry points and within a *Demkhong* to prevent or check movement of unauthorized persons, voters from other *Demkhongs* and not residing in the area, documents, money, alcohol, arms and ammunitions and other restricted items.

## 26. Sealing of the International Border

26.1. The Royal Bhutan Police shall, wherever relevant, make arrangements for the sealing of the international borders for the poll period to ensure smooth conduct of the Elections.

### VOTER EDUCATION AND TRAINING

## 27. Voter Education and Training

- 27.1. A comprehensive general voter education and training programme, the *General Electoral Education Programme (GEEP) for Parliamentary Elections 2013* has been implemented from September 2012 to January 2013 as well as during the National Council *Zomdus* to prepare the voters to take part in the Elections effectively.
- 27.2. Specific Voter Information shall be disseminated further through various media at regular intervals and points of time.
- 27.3. The training of the Returning Officers and Observers as well as briefing session of the 20 Dzongdags and Security Coordinators were already conducted in February 2013. It has been particularly emphasized that no election activity should be taken for granted. Towards this, the system of checklist and double checking shall be maintained and strictly applied no matter how confident an officer may feel to eliminate any scope for error.
- 27.4. The officers to be engaged on election duty in the Elections shall be similarly briefed to handle all situations at the time of elections with minimum supervision.

#### APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVES BY CANDIDATES

### 28. Election Representatives

- 28.1. A Political Party, in the Primary Round, may appoint the Candidate-designate listed in its Letter of Intent or a person meeting the criteria for elections to Local Government or as a voter to be its election representative in a *Demkhong* and perform functions in connection with the election as authorized and required under the Electoral Laws.
- 28.2. A Candidate, in the General Elections, may appoint a person meeting the criteria for elections to Local Government or as a voter to be his/her election representative and perform functions in connection with the election as authorized under the Electoral Laws.
- 28.3. The appointments of the representatives shall be made in the manner prescribed under the Electoral Laws and formally communicated to the concerned Returning Officer.

## 29. Polling and Counting Representatives

- 29.1. The Election Representative or Candidate is entitled to appoint one or more registered voters from a respective *Demkhong* as the Polling Representative for each Polling Station to perform functions in connection with the election and authorized under the Electoral Laws but only one of the representatives shall be present in the Polling Station at any point of time.
- 29.2. The Election Representative or Candidate may appoint a Counting Representative to be present at the counting of votes in the Polling Stations-cum-Counting Centers and the Counting Center setup in a Returning Officer's jurisdiction.
- 29.3. The appointments of the representatives shall be made in the manner prescribed under the Electoral Laws and formally communicated to the concerned Returning Officer.
- 29.4. No person other than a person lawfully appointed shall relay the results from a Counting Centre to the media or any third party.

#### ELECTORAL ROLL AND VOTER PHOTO IDENTITY CARD (VPIC)

## 30. Electoral Roll

- 30.1. The Final Electoral Roll, which is inclusive and error-free, issued by the Department of Electoral Registration and Boundary Delimitation, Election Commission of Bhutan, shall be the sole document for reference on the voters' information.
- 30.2. The qualifying date shall, in relation to the preparation of the Electoral Roll for the National Assembly Elections, be the **1**<sup>st</sup> of April 2013.
  - As such, those who are not younger than eighteen years of age as on 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2013 shall be deemed to meet the minimum age requirement to be a voter.
  - Similarly, those whose *Mitsi* was registered in a *Demkhong* on or before **31**<sup>st</sup> **of March 2012** shall be deemed to meet the legal requirement of minimum one year to vote and stand as a Candidate in that *Demkhong*.
- 30.3. The Draft Electoral Roll was issued on 8<sup>th</sup> of April 2013, for public inspection and to invite the public to file Claims and Objections by 18<sup>th</sup> of April 2013.
- 30.4. The Electoral Roll shall be frozen as of **30**<sup>th</sup> **of April 2013**, providing for the temporary embargo on entries in the Electoral Roll for a period of thirty days before the date of poll.
- 30.5. The Final Electoral Roll shall be divided into Voters' List for each Polling Station.
- 30.6. The Final Electoral Roll shall be appropriately broken up into Eligible Postal Voters' Lists for each Dzongkhag and Voters' Lists for each Polling Station and made available to the Returning Officers latest by 7<sup>th</sup> of May 2013.
- 30.7. The same copy of the Electoral Roll shall be used for the Primary Round as well as the General Elections. Polling Officer 1, for the Primary Round, shall mark a tick (✓) against the name of the voter in the Voter's List and put a slash mark on it (✗) for the General Elections.
- 30.8. The RO shall mark "**PB-PR**" for indicating issuance of Postal Ballot for the Primary Round against the name of a Postal Voter, instead of striking-through. Similarly, for the General Elections, the RO shall mark "**PB-GE**." The voters

- against whose names the letters "**PB-PR**" or "**PB-GE**" are marked shall not be eligible to vote in person in the Polling Stations on the respective Poll Days, as they would have been issued Postal Ballots by the ROs.
- 30.9. A copy of the final Electoral Roll for the respective *Demkhong* shall also be made available to the Parties contesting the elections by **14**<sup>th</sup> of **May 2013**. The same copy should also be used for the General Elections by the Candidates contesting in the General Elections.
- 30.10. The Electoral Roll shall be authorized for use only for electoral purposes.

### 31. Voter Photo Identity Card (VPIC)

- 31.1. The VPIC issued by the Election Commission shall be the valid document for identification of voters at the polling stations during the Elections.
- 31.2. All voters must also carry with them the Citizenship Identity Card issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs. In the event of any dispute related to the identity, the Citizenship Identity Card can form the basis for taking decision by the Presiding Officer.
- 31.3. Voter identity verification in 30 pilot Polling Stations which are the larger polling stations in the 20 Dzongkhags shall be aided through the use of the biometrics to reduce waiting time in the queue.
- 31.4. The Department of Electoral Registration and Boundary Delimitation and the Dzongkhag Electoral Authorities shall ensure that all Bhutanese who are eligible to be registered as voters are being given adequate opportunity to do so and are issued/distributed their individual VPIC with due diligence and processing.
- 31.5. The Department along-with the respective Dzongkhag Election Offices shall take the lead in the VPIC printing and distribution programme. The Dzongkhag Election Offices shall continue to distribute VPICs even up to the Poll Day with those not collected being made available at the respective Polling Stations.

# LETTER OF INTENT, QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS OF CANDIDATES, NOMINATION PAPERS, FILING OF NOMINATION AND SCRUTINY

## 32. Primary Round: Letter of Intent

- 32.1. A registered Political Party wishing to contest the Primary Round of the National Assembly Elections shall file the Letter of Intent (**LoI**), including all the documents as in **Annexure 2**, within the last date specified in the Election Schedule, i.e. **5**<sup>th</sup> **of May 2013** at the Office of the Director, ECB Head Office, Thimphu.
- 32.2. The date and time of receipt of the LoI shall be recorded and signed by the Director or Officer authorized to receive it.
- 32.3. Within the Election Commission of Bhutan, the Letter of Intent shall be first reviewed by the Sub-Committee of the Election Commission for Political Party Registration the submission for compliance with the requirements under the Laws including any others that may have been required of a Political Party by the Election Commission at the time of party registration or review of the annual accounts.
- 32.4. The Sub-Committee shall, on 6<sup>th</sup> of May 2013, the day of Scrutiny specified in the Election Schedule, submit its findings and recommendation to the full Commission for its final scrutiny and decision on acceptance or rejection of the Letter of Intent as filed by the registered Political Parties.
- 32.5. The Commission shall immediately notify the public on its decision with regard to the acceptance or rejection of the Letter of Intent as filed by the registered Political Parties.
- 32.6. The Ballot Paper for the Primary Round shall be prepared by the Department of Elections, with the name and symbol of the contesting Parties, and forwarded by email to all the Returning Officers for their use in issuance of the Postal Ballots and commissioning of the EVMs.
- 32.7. The Election Campaign Fund to the contesting Political Parties shall be released at the earliest possible upon receipt of the Application for the Fund from the Parties.

### 33. General Elections: Qualification of Candidates

- 33.1. A person shall, as per Section 178 of the Election Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan 2008, be qualified to be a candidate or a member of Parliament, if he/she is:
  - 33.1.1. A citizen of Bhutan as evidenced by the Citizenship Identity Card;
  - 33.1.2. A Registered Voter of that *Demkhong* as of **1**<sup>st</sup> **of April 2012**;
  - 33.1.3. Of the minimum age of twenty-five years and not more than maximum age of sixty-five years at the time of filing the nomination; and
  - 33.1.4. Minimum Formal University Degree.

### 34. Disqualification of Candidates

- 34.1. Care must also be taken to take into consideration the disqualifications that have been provided under Section 179 of the Election Act 2008 which provides that a person shall be disqualified as a candidate or a member holding an elective office under the Constitution, if he/she:
  - 34.1.1. Has been convicted for any criminal offence and sentenced to imprisonment;
  - 34.1.2. Has been found guilty of corrupt practice at an election;
  - 34.1.3. Has been dismissed or removed from public service or the corporate sector;
  - 34.1.4. Has failed to lodge account of election expenses within the time and in the manner required by law and has no good reason or justification for the failure:
  - 34.1.5. Has solicited or resorted to any form of fund raising for campaigning in an election to Parliament or Local Governments from private individuals or any agency.
  - 34.1.6. Is married to a person who is not a citizen of Bhutan;
  - 34.1.7. Has been accused of felony in a pending case and the competent Court has taken cognisance and charges have been framed against him/her;
  - 34.1.8. Is in arrears of taxes or other dues to government;

- 34.1.9. Has an existing contract with the government which has not been fully performed;
- 34.1.10. Is working as a civil servant;
- 34.1.11. Holds any office of profit as prescribed under Chapter 9 of the Election Act; or
- 34.1.12. Is so disqualified under the Election Act 2008.
- 34.2. The criteria have been further elaborated in the Rules, Regulations, Guidelines Interpretation and Strategy for Implementation documents.

## 35. Nomination Papers

- 35.1. A Candidate nominated by the two Parties with the highest total votes in the Primary Round is required to submit his/her Nomination Papers to contest the General Elections in the *Demkhong* with the respective Returning Officer.
- 35.2. The Nomination Papers must be complete, signed and countersigned as required and include, in the prescribed forms (as provided in this Strategy document as **Annexure 3** and also available in the *Handbook for Returning Officers*), the following:
  - 35.2.1. **Returning Officer Form No. 5A:** Nomination Paper for Candidate Contesting National Assembly Election with the necessary attachments;
  - 35.2.2. **Returning Officer Form No. 6:** Notice of Endorsement of Nomination of the Candidate *General Elections to National Assembly*;
  - 35.2.3. Returning Officer Form No. 7 General (G10) Affidavit of Candidate (Election): Affidavit from a Royal Court of Justice including Non-Criminal Conviction Record-Cum-Clearance from the respective Court of Law that he/she has not been accused of felony in a pending case, taken cognisance by a Court of Law and charges framed;
  - 35.2.4. Asset Declaration Form No. 3;
  - 35.2.5. Tax Clearance Certificate:

- 35.2.6. Audit Clearance Certificate;
- 35.2.7. Security Clearance (for Elections);
- 35.2.8. Marriage Certificate, if married;
- 35.2.9. Letter of Attestation from the Royal University of Bhutan, endorsing the Formal University Degree Certificate; and
- 35.2.10. Relieving order issued by Head of the Ministry/ Department/Agency (if relevant).
- 35.3. The Affidavit, as in **Returning Officer Form No. 7**, shall be signed by the concerned the Drangpon of the Dzongkhag Court of Justice who shall also be responsible to check from the Court records that the aspiring candidate has not been convicted and received a sentence of imprisonment or does not have a pending criminal case registered against him/her in any Court of Law as required under the Electoral Laws.
- 35.4. All who sign and countersign the documents shall be held responsible and answerable for the correctness of the facts.
- 35.5. The general public had been advised through **Notification No. ECB/Notif- 01/2013/2290** dated **5**<sup>th</sup> **of February 2013** that all voters interested in contesting the Parliamentary Elections 2013 as a Candidate should start processing the necessary clearances and documents.

## **36.** Filing of Nomination

36.1. The candidate shall complete and file with the concerned Returning Officer, on or before 11<sup>th</sup> of June 2013, the last date of nomination, all the required nomination documents, as outlined above, signed and countersigned as required.

## 37. Scrutiny of Nominations

- 37.1. The scrutiny of nominations shall be done by the Returning Officer of the respective *Demkhongs* on the day immediately following the last date for Filing of Nominations i.e. on **12**<sup>th</sup> **of June 2013**, in accordance with the Electoral Laws, Rules and Regulations while keeping the Election Commission informed on the candidatures and scrutiny.
- 37.2. The respective Returning Officers shall undertake the scrutiny of the Nomination

- Papers filed by the Candidates under intimation to the Election Commission.
- 37.3. The cross-checking of Asset Declarations shall be in line with the Strategy for Evaluation of the Asset Declaration of the Candidates Contesting Elections, 2012 and the Guidelines for Implementation of Sections 163-174 of the Election Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2008 relating to Office of Profit, 2012 issued by the Election Commission.
- 37.4. The screenshot (webpage) displaying the approved status of the Security Clearance, specified for election purposes can be printed out and the copy made available during the selection *Zomdu* as well as provided to a Returning Officer at the time of submission of nomination papers.
- 37.5. Audit Clearance may be obtained as per the system put in place by the Royal Audit Authority and the print out copy submitted at the time of submission of Nomination Papers.
- 37.6. The attestation of the Formal University Degree shall be as per the Guidelines for Interpretation and Implementation of Sections 176 (d), 177 (d) and 178 (d) of the Election Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2008 regarding the Academic Qualification Requirement for a Candidate contesting Elections to National Assembly, National Council or the Post of Thrompon, 2012.
  - However, those Candidates who had filed such a Letter of Attestation at an earlier election held under the Constitution and it had been duly accepted by a Returning Officer need not produce the Letter of Attestation and the copy of the Formal University Degree unless otherwise found necessary by an election authority.
- 37.7. The Returning Officer shall take care to note that the Date of Birth of a Candidate, to meet the age requirement under the laws, must be on or before 11<sup>th</sup> of June 1988 and on or after 12<sup>th</sup> of June 1948.
- 37.8. The Returning Officer shall be responsible to maintain a foolproof system to eliminate possibility of any candidate misrepresenting the facts.
- 37.9. A Returning Officer shall be held fully answerable for any lapse resulting from the lack of exercise of due diligence in the Scrutiny of the Nomination papers filed by a candidate.

37.10. The Returning Officer shall fulfill all requirements, including putting up required information on a Public Notice Board, as required under the laws.

# 38. Last Date for Withdrawal of Letter of Intent/Candidature

- 38.1. The last date for withdrawal from the Elections for the Primary Round by a Political Party shall be **5 p.m.** of the **8**<sup>th</sup> **of May 2013** as per Section 225 of the *Election Act 2008*.
- 38.2. The last date for withdrawal of candidature for the General Elections shall be **5 p.m.** of **14**<sup>th</sup> **of June 2013** as per Section 225 of the *Election Act 2008*.

# REPLACEMENT CANDIDATE

# 39. Replacement Candidate

39.1. In a *Demkhong* where candidature has been cancelled or a Candidate dies, the replacement Candidate may be nominated or polls in that *Demkhong* postponed in accordance with Sections 233 to 237 of the Election Act, 2008.

# **ELECTION CODE OF CONDUCT**

## 40. Code of Conduct

- 40.1. The Election Code of Conduct shall come into force from the date of the Notifications calling for Elections issued by the Election Commission and shall continue to be in force until the completion of the Election Period i.e. from 28<sup>th</sup> of April 2013 to 14<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.
- 40.2. The Members of the National Council shall, as members of an apolitical body, apart from casting their votes not play any direct or indirect role in the National Assembly Elections or directly or indirectly campaign for any Party and or Candidate.
- 40.3. A Party/ Candidate shall be held answerable for the conduct of their workers, supporters or representatives. Therefore, a Party/Candidate should regularly caution them against inciting or causing law and order problems.
- 40.4. All election officers, political parties, candidates and voters must comply with the Election Code of Conduct and the provisions of the Electoral Laws, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Notifications and Orders made thereunder.

#### **CAMPAIGN**

# 41. Election Campaign

- 41.1. The campaign period for the Primary Round shall commence from 6<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 onwards and must stop at 9 a.m. of 29<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 i.e. 48 hours before the hour fixed for commencement of Polls.
- 41.2. For the General Elections, the campaign period shall commence from 12<sup>th</sup> of June 2013 and must end at 9 a.m. of 11<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.
- 41.3. A Party/Candidate could therefore have more than three weeks for campaigning in both the Primary Round and the General Elections.
- 41.4. In the Primary Round, a member of a Political Party who is listed as a potential Candidate of a *Demkhong* on the *Tentative List of Candidates* submitted by a Party as part of the Letter of Intent submission may campaign on behalf of the Party as the authorized Election Representative.
- 41.5. A Party/Candidate shall conduct its/his/her campaign strictly as per the Election Campaign Schedule approved by the concerned Returning Officer and copy endorsed to the Observer. If any changes are required, the Returning Officer's approval must be sought and the Observer informed accordingly.
- 41.6. Any changes in the Schedule shall be only with the approval of the Returning Officer.
- 41.7. The campaign schedule shall be intimated to the voters through public communication and notice on the Election Advertising Boards while it must be ensured that no coercion or deterrence is exercised for attendance by the voters to the meetings.
- 41.8. A Candidate may proceed with his/her Election Campaigning upon the acceptance of his/her candidature by the concerned Returning Officer.
- 41.9. The campaign schedule shall be intimated to the voters through public communication and notice on the Election Advertising Boards while it must be ensured that no coercion or deterrence is exercised for attendance by the voters to the meetings.
- 41.10. The Returning Officer, in consultation with the respective Election Coordinator

- and Security Coordinator shall arrange a Common Forum in each *Gewog/Dzongkhag Thromde*, starting from the 11<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 in the case of the Primary Round, to provide the Political Parties and the Candidates equal opportunity to address the electorate.
- 41.11. A Party/Candidate contesting the Elections and all concerned shall neither serve meals or refreshments, including *Tshogchang*, *Suchang/Joenchang* and *Dongchang*, nor pay the general public or voters for attendance of election campaigns or produce and distribute T-shirts and caps.
- 41.12. Any other public meetings, door-to-door campaigns or rallies shall be subject to the provisions of the law, code of conduct and as per the campaign schedule and use of vehicles as approved by the Returning Officer. Specifically, door-to-door campaign shall **not be conducted before 7 a.m.** and **after 8 p.m**.
- 41.13. Except in the capacity of an Election Official mandated to fulfill a required function, a civil servant should not campaign or attend campaigns or political meetings.
- 41.14. No travels or official tours shall be undertaken by a Member of Parliament to any *Demkhong* other than the place of ordinary residence during the Election Period except to cast votes on the Poll Days if he/she decides not to avail the Postal Ballot facility. If such travel to a *Demkhong* becomes unavoidable, he/she shall first report to the concerned Returning Officer.
- 41.15. No Candidate shall use the title, designation, rank, *kabney*, *pata*, or any other sign, insignia or symbol of an office held earlier, on person, car or any personal effects as may be used during the campaign period by the Party, Candidate, representatives or supporters.
- 41.16. A Candidate shall bear responsibility for the conduct of their representatives or supporters.
- 41.17. A Candidate, Government or Non-Governmental Authority, Organisation or any individual shall not screen any audiovisual products or documentary clips or display/distribute any written or pictorial materials which attributes or depicts the past achievements of a particular aspiring Candidate whilst in Government or public service or otherwise, including the portrayal of a Candidate in any audiovisual product.

- 41.18. Public debates for the Candidates and Parties shall be conducted in collaboration with the BBS TV as per the *Guidelines for Conduct of Public Debates during Parliamentary Elections*, 2012.
- 41.19. There shall be two rounds of Public Debates for the Primary Round with Round One on 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 focusing on Political Party Ideology and Round Two on 10<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 on Issues to be addressed in the ensuing elections.
- 41.20. The Public Debates for General Elections shall be between the two Candidates of the two Parties contesting in the General Elections and held in the Dzongkhags for each of the 47 *Demkhongs* on the respective plans, programmes and activities.
- 41.21. All Banks or financial institutions will report to the Election Commission any abnormal transaction of money, including in the account of a candidate or Political Party contesting the Elections.

#### 42. Common Forum

- 42.1. The Common Forum shall be conducted strictly as per the requirements set out in the *Guidelines for the Conduct of the Common Forum for Election Campaign*, 2013.
- 42.2. The Security Coordinator shall ensure peace at every such gathering.
- 42.3. No entertainment and refreshments, or any form of hospitality, will be allowed to be arranged by anyone for the voters gathered.
- 42.4. At least one Common Forum for the Primary Round in each of the forty-seven *Demkhongs* shall be covered and broadcast by the BBSC.

# 43. Election Advertising

- 43.1. Election Advertising, including the various advertising materials such as brochures, cards, banners, posters as well as advertisement in the newspaper of choice and allocation of time on electronic media, which is to be financed by the State shall be done as set out in the *Strategy for the Implementation of the Election Advertising Regulations*.
- 43.2. All Political Parties, Candidates or election representatives shall, during the election period, abide by the provisions of the *Election Advertising Regulations*

of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2012 and the Social Media Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2012. In particular they shall ensure that advertising using the Internet or Social Media is as per the Positive List of Election Advertising.

43.3. All Media Agencies/Houses/Service Providers shall abide the Media Code of Conduct and in particular ensure that the rates offered for election advertisement in a periodical publication or on radio or television is charged uniformly to all Political Parties or Candidates during the same campaign period.

# 44. Election Campaign Funds and Expenditure

- 44.1. A Party/Candidate whose LoI/Nomination for contesting the National Assembly Elections 2013 has been accepted by the Election Commission/Returning Officer shall file their Application for Election Campaign Fund as in **Annexure 4**.
  - The Election Campaign Fund shall be released latest by the next day of such application.
- 44.2. A Party, contesting in the Primary Round of the *Parliamentary Elections 2013: National Assembly*, cannot exceed the election campaign expense beyond the ceiling fixed by the Election Commission and notified to the public vide Notification No. EB/PEFD/08/2012/394 dated 20<sup>th</sup> of September 2012 i.e. total of Nu. 260,000/- with Nu.130,000/- being provided by the State and up to an equivalent amount being permitted to be spent from the Party's resources, raised from the permissible sources.
- 44.3. A Candidate, contesting in the General Elections, cannot exceed the election campaign expenditure ceiling fixed by the Election Commission and notified to the public vide Notification No. EB/PEFD/08/2012/394 dated 20<sup>th</sup> of September 2012 i.e. total of Nu. 260,000/- with Nu.130,000/- being provided by the State and up to an equivalent amount being permitted to be spent from the Party's resources, raised from the permissible sources.
- 44.4. For this purpose a Party/Candidate must open, before filing in the nomination papers, an account to be called the (Party/Candidate Name) Campaign Account with any Bank licensed to operate in Bhutan, and submit the details of the same at the time of filing the Letter of Intent/Nomination.

- However, the Election Commission shall waive this requirement in case of the absence of banking facility in a Dzongkhag and/or if a Party/Candidate gives a written undertaking stating that it/he/she does not intend to incur any expenditure for election campaigning.
- 44.5. A Party/Candidate shall ensure that only a lump-sum amount for financing the campaign expenses, subject to the ceiling, is deposited in this campaign account.
- 44.6. A Party/Candidate shall spend out of the campaign account only for the activities permitted as expenses for election campaign under Section 77 of the Election Fund Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan 2008.
- 44.7. The permissible campaign expenses are:
  - 44.7.1. Goods and services required for direct campaign purposes only;
  - 44.7.2. Production of manifesto, introductory leaflets or visiting cards;
  - 44.7.3. Hire of motor vehicles for campaign purposes or for meeting transportation cost;
  - 44.7.4. Communication expenses such as telephone, fax and postage;
  - 44.7.5. Stationery including revenue and legal stamps; and
  - 44.7.6. Daily Subsistence Allowance for Election and Polling Representatives.
- 44.8. The offering or purchase of gift or donations for offices, individuals, business units or any organization for any other purpose is prohibited.
- 44.9. A Party/Candidate may authorize in writing any person to withdraw funds from the candidate's campaign account and incur expenditure on its/his/her behalf.
- 44.10. No fresh expenses from the campaign account shall be incurred by a Party/Candidate after the closure of the campaign period.
- 44.11. A Party/Candidate shall maintain proper records of expenditure incurred during the elections and ensure that all the payments made are fully supported by proper bills/receipts/cash memo and where such documents are not available, the Party/Candidate shall use the **Public Election Fund Form No. 10** affixed with legal stamps on the agreement document and revenue stamps for each payment.

44.12. A Party/Candidate shall ensure that all bills including receipts, cash memo or any other supporting documents are countersigned by the respective National Observer or the Micro-Observer, wherever authorized by the National Observer.

# 45. Election Campaign Returns

- 45.1. A Party/Candidate must submit accounts of campaign and file Election Returns as per the prescribed procedures set out in the *Guidelines for Monitoring Campaign Expenditures for Parliamentary Elections*, 2012 regardless of being elected or not.
- 45.2. A National Observer and the Micro-Observer shall also serve as the Expenditure Observer.
- 45.3. The Party/Candidate or the Representative shall submit till the last day of campaign, an expenditure statement in **Public Election Fund Form No. 3**, to the National Observer or the authorized Micro-Observer, on a weekly basis as per an agreed schedule drawn up on the expenditures incurred or authorized by them.
- 45.4. A National Observer or the authorized Micro-Observer shall countersign on all the expenditures statement submitted by a candidate and maintain the record in the **Public Election Fund Form No. 11**.
- 45.5. A Party/Candidate must file the Returns of Election Expenses to the concerned Dzongkhag Electoral Office or directly to the Public Election Fund Division within thirty days of declaration of the Election Result in the prescribed Form (Public Election Fund Form No. 7D) along with the following supporting documents:
  - 45.5.1. The list of campaign expenses incurred by the Party/Candidate (Public Election Fund Form No. 3) and countersigned by an authorized Observer; and
  - 45.5.2. Bank Statement of the campaign account which cannot be substituted by any other documents or statement.
- 45.6. The Returning Officer must inform a Party/Candidate that election campaign expense incurred and the Election Returns shall be subject to audit by the Royal Audit Authority. Failure to file Election Returns within the stipulated time may

result in disqualification in future elections.

45.7. The Forms related to Public Election Campaign Funds and Expenditure Returns are in **Annexure 4**.

# 46. End of Campaign Period

46.1. A Party/Candidate must stop election campaign 48 hours before the hour fixed for Commencement of Poll i.e. by 9:00 a.m. of 29<sup>th</sup> of May 2013 in case of the Primary Round and 9 a.m. of 11<sup>th</sup> of July 2013 in case of the General Elections.

# **SOCIAL MEDIA**

# 47. Use of Social Media

- 47.1. All electoral stakeholders may use the social media for election or campaign purposes but shall ensure to abide generally by the Electoral Laws, Election Code of Conduct and specifically adhere to the requirements under the *Social Media Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012.
- 47.2. All Election Officers operating Facebook, Twitter or any other social media accounts shall do so strictly as per the requirements in the *Social Media Rules* and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2012.

# 48. Social Media Related Disputes

48.1. The Media Arbitrator shall be responsible for monitoring and settling disputes related to social media as per the *Social Media Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012.

## **ELECTION CONTROL ROOMS**

## 49. Election Control Rooms

- 49.1. Election Control Rooms shall be set up and maintained during the elections for the purpose of supervision, direction and monitoring the conduct of elections and to respond to any security threats or provide administrative guidance on real time basis besides receiving reports and feedback.
- 49.2. The Control Room in the Centre shall be in operation with the start of the Election Period and 48 hours prior to the commencement of poll till the declaration of results, manned round the clock.
- 49.3. Election Control Rooms, set up Dzongkhags as well as the Central ECB levels, shall function as per the procedures set out in the *Manual for Election Control Rooms*. The Control Rooms in the Dzongkhags shall regularly monitor the movement of the polling team to its polling station. In those *Demkhongs* where the Polling Teams have departed to remote Polling Stations, the Control Room will be set up on the day prior to the date of departure.
- 49.4. The Central Control Room shall be responsible to monitor, receive and review the reports from the Observers and submit weekly status reports to the Election Commission, except in case of any non-regular situation in any *Demkhong* it shall be immediately brought to the notice of the Election Commission.

## **BALLOT PAPER**

# 50. Ballot Paper for the Primary Round

- 50.1. The Ballot Paper for the Primary Round shall be prepared by the Department of Elections and sent to the Returning Officers by email on 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2013, after the last date for withdrawal.
- 50.2. The Names and Election Symbols of the Political Parties on the Ballot Papers shall be in alphabetical order of the name of the Political Parties.
- 50.3. Care must be taken to ensure that the names and symbols are assigned and listed correctly and without any error.

# 51. Ballot Paper for the General Election

- 51.1. The Returning Officer must make sure that photographs of the Candidates required for the Ballot Papers in the General Elections are taken upon acceptance of the Nominations and the Ballots printed as per the prescribed specifications.
- 51.2. The Returning Officer shall assign the names, photographs of the Candidates and the election symbols of their respective Political Parties on the Ballot Paper in alphabetical order of the name of the Candidates.
- 51.3. Care must be taken to ensure that the names, photographs and symbols are assigned and listed correctly and without any error.

# **52.** Electronic Voting Machines (EVM)

52.1. EVMs shall be set ready for every Polling Station along with a spare EVM set ready in case a machine malfunctions.

#### POSTAL BALLOT

#### 53. Postal Ballot

- 53.1. An eligible Postal Voter, including spouses and dependents permissible under Section 331 of the Election Act 2008, must first register with the Election Commission through one's department/ agency/ organization to be included in the Postal Voters' List issued to the Returning Officers.
- 53.2. Eligible postal voters were notified in the year 2012 itself to register with the Election Commission for the Parliamentary Elections 2013. A voter can check the status of registration as a Postal Voter on the ECB website.
- 53.3. The postal ballot arrangements for postal voters in the United States of America shall be as per the *Guidelines for Extending Postal Ballot Facility to the Bhutanese Citizens Residing, Studying or Working in the United States of America*, 2012.
- 53.4. For the *Parliamentary Elections 2013*, the Postal Ballot facility has been extended, besides the diplomats, civil servants, Armed Forces, students and trainees, to the employees of various public and private corporations and private businesses and enterprises.
- 53.5. The registered Postal Voters must apply for the Postal Ballot to the concerned Returning Officer and ensure to do it such that the application reaches the Returning Officer by **5.00 p.m.** of **8**<sup>th</sup> **of May 2013**.
- 53.6. A Postal Ballot Application may be hand delivered, sent by post or scanned and emailed to the Returning Officers but faxed copies shall not be entertained.
- 53.7. The Returning Officer shall send Postal Voter's Instructions to every Postal Voter along with the Postal Ballot package to facilitate the voters.
- 53.8. The Returning Officer shall have the overall responsibility to oversee that care is taken by the officers under his/her control to avoid any confusion of the packing, dispatching, receipt and the separation of the Postal Ballot under his/her jurisdiction.
- 53.9. An Assistant Returning Officer shall have the duty to ensure that care is taken to avoid any confusion of the packing, dispatching, receipt and the separation of the Postal Ballot under his/her jurisdiction.

- 53.10. Bhutan Post shall have the full responsibility to ensure that the delivery of the Postal Ballots is carried out strictly as per the Terms and Conditions set out in the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).
- 53.11. To facilitate Postal Voters to vote by post, the Election Commission shall set up Clinics in public places where Postal Voters can drop by and get the Forms or any required assistance in filling it up.
- 53.12. Out of the six AROs, one shall be in ECB Head Office with the responsibility to handle the Postal Ballots of the overseas Postal Voters, other than the USA, and remote areas in the country, to speed up the delivery of the Postal Ballots.
- 53.13. The ARO at ECB Head Office shall issue Postal Ballots based on the Lists and Postal Ballots soft copies received from the concerned ROs.
- 53.14. One ARO shall be at the Permanent Mission of Bhutan to the UN in New York, United States of America and shall be responsible to handle the Postal Ballots of those Postal Voters who are in the USA.
- 53.15. These AROs shall functions as per the terms and conditions spelt out in the respective Appointment Orders.

# **POLLING STATIONS**

# **54.** Polling Stations

- 54.1. The List of Polling Stations shall be as indicated in the Final Electoral Roll for the *Parliamentary Elections 2013: National Assembly*.
- 54.2. There shall be a total of **850** Polling Stations for the National Assembly Elections 2013.
- 54.3. Every Polling Station shall have in place basic amenities such as safe drinking water, first-aid, toilet facilities etc. essential for convenience of voters.
- 54.4. The Polling Stations where there is no acceptable government structure shall be set-up and managed by the Dzongkhags and supervised by the Department of Elections as per the *Strategy for Management of Temporary Polling Stations*.
- 54.5. In the unique situation of the *Yusarnang* village of Gasa Dzongkhag being physically remote and inaccessible for most part of the year with a tiny voter population of 18 voters, arrangements shall be made for these voters to vote in *Raminang* Polling Station and provided TA/DA as may be provided to a public official under the financial norms.
- 54.6. Due courtesy to the elderly, disabled, mothers with infants shall be extended in terms of being given preference in a queue on Poll Day. Those requiring physical assistance in the Voting Compartment shall be permitted to take an assistant of choice.

# 55. Polling Station Layout

55.1. The Layout of a Polling Station shall be as in **Fig. 1**.

# **56.** Polling Procedure

- 56.1. The Control Units shall be handled by the Polling Officer III who would be responsible for releasing each Ballot for the voter as he/she moves from one voting compartment to the next.
- 56.2. The Polling Officer III shall release the Ballot for the next voter only after the previous voter exits the voting compartment.
- 56.3. The Presiding Officer and the Polling Assistant at every Polling Station can help those voters who still need assistance as per the Electoral Laws, rules and regulations.
- 56.4. The Presiding Officer shall be responsible to ensure that the Voting Compartment is well-lit and the EVM is properly fixed and ink smears cleaned from time to time.
- 56.5. All procedures in the Polling Stations shall be carried out in an open and

transparent manner as detailed in the Laws except for the Voting Compartment area which must be ensured to provide absolute secrecy of the ballot.

# **57.** Polling Officials

- 57.1. The poll shall be conducted by a minimum of five election officers, which include:
  - 57.1.1. Presiding Officer;
  - 57.1.2. Polling Officer I;
  - 57.1.3. Polling Officer II;
  - 57.1.4. Polling Officer III; and
  - 57.1.5. Polling Assistant.

#### **POLL DAY**

# 58. Poll Day

- 58.1. The Poll Day of the Parliamentary Elections 2013: National Assembly shall be:
  - 58.1.1. Primary Round on 31st of May 2013; and
  - 58.1.2. General Elections on 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.
- 58.2. The Hours of Polling shall be from **9.00 a.m.** to **5.00 p.m**.
- 58.3. The Poll Day shall be declared a National Holiday while organisations associated with the conduct of the Elections such as Bhutan Post, Power, Telecom Service and such essential public service providers shall remain operational with the key personnel essential for operation being extended the privilege of Postal Ballot facility.
- 58.4. All employers, if an employee notifies before the poll that he/ she desires leave of absence for voting at any election, are required as per Section 338 of the Election Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan 2008, to grant leave of absence, for reasonable period as is necessary to enable him/her to vote at the election subject to the exceptions made in Sections 339 and 341.
- 58.5. No alcohol shall be permitted to be sold or served from the start of poll till counting is closed at the Counting Centres.
- 58.6. All shops and businesses in the *Demkhongs* where polls are being held shall remain closed on the day of polling and counting of results.
- 58.7. No person shall be permitted to carry firearms on the day of polling except for those on security duty authorised under laws.
- 58.8. No weapons, including a pen-knife or any sharp object excluding a standard walking stick shall be permitted in the Polling Station except for those required for security duty.
- 58.9. No one shall be allowed to carry mobile phones, cameras or any gadget that records sound or image in and around the Polling Station or carry any sort of weapons or arms which can be used to cause bodily harm on Poll Day except for those whose duty requires it and as per the permission of the Returning Officer.
- 58.10. Media personnel authorized for coverage of elections by the Election

Commission shall be allowed to enter and video-graph the Polling Station but not have access to the voting compartment when a voter is inside it and be escorted out of the Polling Station after a few minutes.

58.11. All persons and agencies shall be required to abide strictly by the legal provisions in the Electoral Acts and the Rules, Regulations or Notifications issued there under, also including the *Permissible and Non-Permissible Activities during Forty-Eight Hours Before Commencement of Poll and the Poll Day Rules*, 2009.

# 59. Voter Turn-Out Recording and Reporting

- 59.1. The Polling Officer 1 shall use the **Polling Officer Form No. 1** to record the age category of the voters who turn up to vote on the Poll Days.
- 59.2. The Yellow Voter Slip shall be issued for a female voter and the White Voter Slip for a male voter to facilitate the recording of gender disaggregated information on the voters who turn up to vote on the two Poll Days.
- 59.3. The Presiding Officers shall submit to the concerned Returning Officer for their respective Polling Stations the Mid-Day Voter Turn-Out Report for the voter turn-out from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and the Poll-End Voter Turn-Out Report for the Cumulative Total Voter Turn-Out from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the **Voter Turn-Out Report Form No. 1**.
- 59.4. The Returning Officer shall compile the Mid-Day Voter Turn-Out Reports submitted by the Presiding Officers and send the consolidated Mid-Day Voter Turn-Out Report to the National Results Centre at the earliest possible and no later than 2 p.m. Similarly, the Poll-End Voter Turn-Out Reports shall also be compiled and the consolidated reports submitted to the National Results Centre alongwith the Election Results after the Polls on the Poll Days itself.
- 59.5. The arrangements set out in the SMS-Based Voter Turn-Out and Election Result Relay Rules and Regulations, 2013, based on the experience of the recent National Council Elections shall be modified for the National Assembly Elections as follows:
  - 59.5.1. The Voter Turn-Out and the Election Results Reports from the Presiding Officer to the Returning Officer and from the Returning Officer to the National Results Centre shall be sent through fax and/or

phone (and not by SMS); and

- 59.5.2. The National Results Centre shall input the SMS information in the SMS System to generate the necessary Voter Turn-Out and Election Result Reports.
- 59.6. Separate and dedicated teams shall be formed in the National Results Centre, responsible for receiving, checking and inputting the Voter Turn-Out information and Election Result for their assigned *Demkhongs*. The teams shall establish prior and clear communication links with the respective Returning Officers to ensure that the information flow is smooth and reports are received without delay on Poll Day.
- 59.7. The Poll Day proceedings shall be updated on the ECB website and *Facebook* regularly by the administrator, with a log diary being maintained, so that all interested can follow the news via the internet.

# COUNTING, CONSOLIDATION, ANNOUNCEMENT AND DECLARATION OF RESULTS

# 60. Polling Station and Counting Centre


- 60.1. The Polling and Counting of the Election Results shall take place on the same day as per the procedure adopted under the EVM Rules and Regulations, Handbooks for Returning, Presiding, and Polling Officers, Counting Supervisors as well as in the Appointment Orders and this Strategy Document.
- 60.2. The Returning Officer shall issue an Office Order instructing that Polling Stations/Booths at the close of Poll shall function as Counting Centres and the results from the EVMs used for recording the votes counted as per the set procedure.
- 60.3. The Returning Officer shall detail, in the Appointment Order, the Officials who shall assume the positions of Counting Supervisors and Assistant Counting Supervisors upon the close of poll and the Polling Booth becoming a Counting Centre.
- 60.4. Every Polling station shall have a clearly demarcated boundary within which no unauthorized persons or act prohibited activities are allowed under the electoral laws.
- 60.5. Any complaint alleging any untoward incident related to a poll reported by any person at the poll day and within a polling station be entertained by any election officer on duty if submitted in writing with evidence and witnesses as per the prescribed Election Complaint Form, presented as **Annexure 5**.

# 61. Counting of Votes of the Primary Round

- 61.1. The counting and announcement of results of counting of votes at a Polling Station shall be carried out as per the stepwise procedure directed here below:
  - 61.1.1. After the counting of votes on the EVMs used for casting votes, the results shall be recorded in the Electronic Voting Machine Form No.3A and the EVMs sealed as per procedure by the respective Counting Supervisor;
  - 61.1.2. The Counting Supervisor shall issue to every Party Representative present, a duly authenticated true copy; and

- 61.1.3. The Counting Supervisor shall thereafter transmit the results of the Primary Round by fax/phone/hand delivery of hard copy to the respective RO as per procedure.
- 61.2. The graphical presentation of the process of result counting is as presented in **Fig. 2.**

# 62. Sorting and Counting of the Postal Ballots

62.1. The Returning Officer shall arrange and conduct the Opening of the **Envelope** "A", received till date, between five and two days before the Poll Day as per procedures prescribed in the *Postal Ballot Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012.

The **Envelope** "A" received after such opening shall be placed in another **Postal Ballot Box** "A" provided for this purpose. This Box shall be opened, as per procedure, after the last date and time for receiving Postal Ballots i.e. after **5.00 p.m.** of **30**<sup>th</sup> of May **2013**.

62.2. The Postal Ballots in **Postal Ballot Box** "B" shall be counted on Poll Day with such counting started before 1 p.m. to ensure that the Postal Ballots are counted before the close of Polls and receipt of the EVM Results.


# 63. Consolidation of Results in each *Demkhong*

- 63.1. The consolidation of results of the Primary Round in each *Demkhong* by the respective Returning Officer must be carried out as per the stepwise procedure directed here below:
  - 63.1.1. The RO shall count the Postal Ballots received for the election and enter the results in **Postal Ballot Form No. 4.**
  - 63.1.2. The RO shall compile the results received from all the Counting Centres in the *Demkhongs* under his/her jurisdiction in **EVM Form**

## No. 3A.

- 63.1.3. The RO shall consolidate the Postal Ballot Results and the EVM Results in **EVM Form No. 4/Final Result Sheet Form No. 1A** and transmit the final results of the elections to the National Results Centre by fax/telephone.
- 63.2. The graphical presentation of the process of consolidating the **Primary Round** results by the Returning Officer is as presented in **Fig. 3**.

# 64. Announcement of Results

- 64.1. The Returning Officer shall announce the total number of valid votes received by each Political Party in a *Demkhong* as per **Returning Officer Form No. 14**.
- 64.2. The Returning Officer shall then transmit a duly authenticated copy of the said Form (**Returning Officer Form No. 14**) to the National Results Centre of the Election Commission.
- 64.3. The National Results Centre of the Election Commission shall consolidate the results received from all 47 *Demkhongs*.
- 64.4. The Election Commission shall declare by Public Notification the total votes received by each of the Political Parties in the Primary Round on 1<sup>st</sup> of June 2013.
- 64.5. The process of declaration of the Primary Round Election Results is graphically presented in **Fig. 4**.

64.6. A Party/Representative shall be advised not to communicate the result of counting or election to any other person including media prior to the formal declaration by the competent authority.



Fig. 5: Overview of the Process of Counting, Consolidation, Announcement and Declaration of the Primary Round Results




# 66. Invitation to Nominate Candidates to Contest the General Elections

66.1. The Election Commission shall invite the two Political Parties securing the First Highest and Second Highest total number of votes polled in the 20 Dzongkhags to nominate one Candidate each to contest the General Elections in each of the 47 National Assembly Demkhongs.

# 67. Counting of Votes of the General Election

- 67.1. The counting and announcement of results of counting of votes in the General Election at a Polling Station shall be carried out as per the stepwise procedure directed here below:
  - 67.1.1. After the counting of votes on the EVMs used for casting votes, the results shall be recorded in the Electronic Voting Machine Form No.3B and the EVMs sealed as per procedure by the respective Counting Supervisor;
  - 67.1.2. The Counting Supervisor shall issue to every candidate or his/her election or counting representative present, a duly authenticated true copy; and
  - 67.1.3. The Counting Supervisor shall thereafter transmit the results of the elections as per the format provided by fax/phone/hand delivery of hard copy to the respective RO as per procedure.
- 67.2. The graphical presentation of the process of result counting is as presented in **Fig. 6.**

# 68. Sorting and Counting of the Postal Ballots

68.1. The Returning Officer shall arrange and conduct the Opening of the **Envelope** "A", received till date, between five and two days before the Poll Day as per procedures prescribed in the *Postal Ballot Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2012.


The **Envelope** "A" received after such opening shall be placed in another **Postal Ballot Box** "A" provided for this purpose. This Box shall be opened, as per procedure, after the last date and time for receiving Postal Ballots i.e. after **5.00 p.m.** of **12**<sup>th</sup> **of July 2013**.

68.2. The Postal Ballots in **Postal Ballot Box** "B" shall be counted on Poll Day with such counting started before 1 p.m. to ensure that the Postal Ballots are counted before the close of Polls and receipt of the EVM Results.

# 69. Consolidation of Results in each *Demkhong*

- 69.1. The consolidation of results of the election of the General Election must be carried out as per the stepwise procedure directed here below:
  - 69.1.1. The RO shall count the Postal Ballots received for the election and enter the results in **Postal Ballot Form No. 4.**
  - 69.1.2. The RO shall compile the results received from all the Counting Centres in the *Demkhongs* under his/her jurisdiction in **EVM Form** No. 3B.
  - 69.1.3. The RO shall consolidate the Postal Ballot Results and the EVM Results in **EVM Form No. 4/Final Result Sheet Form No. 1B** and transmit the final results of the elections to the National Results Centre by fax/phone.
- 69.2. The graphical presentation of the process of consolidating the General Election results by the Returning Officer is as presented in **Fig. 7**.

Fig. 7: Consolidation of Results by the RO in respective *Demkhongs* 




## **70.** Announcement of Results

- 70.1. The Returning Officer shall announce the Candidate who has secured the highest number of valid votes in a *Demkhong* as per **Returning Officer Form No. 14**.
- 70.2. The Returning Officer shall then transmit a duly authenticated copy of the said Announcement Forms (**Returning Officer Form No. 14**) to the Election Commission.

- 70.3. The Returning Officer shall publish the result of the Poll Count as per the **Result**Announcement Form No. 5B.
- 70.4. The Election Commission shall declare by Public Notification the results of the General Elections on 14<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.
- 70.5. The process of announcement of the General Election Results is graphically presented in **Fig. 8**.

Fig. 8: Announcement of Results




70.6. A Candidate or his/her representative shall be advised not to communicate the result of counting or election to any other person including media prior to the formal declaration by a competent authority.

  - (2) General Elections Result Announcement Form No. 5B
- 72.1.6. Form for Publication of the Election Result (by Returning Officer) Same as the Announcement i.e. Result Announcement Form No. 5A and 5B
- 72.2. Certificate of Election to Successful Candidate (by the Election Commission)

## **COMMUNICATION PLAN**

#### 73. Communication Plan

- 73.1. The *Bhutan Election Directory 2013* shall contain contact details of all acceptable mediums, of the election officials, Parties, Candidates and office bearers to facilitate effective communications, monitoring and reporting during the elections.
- 73.2. Communications would be vital for the relaying of the voter turn-out information and results as well as periodic reporting by polling teams to the respective Control Rooms.
- 73.3. The procedures to be followed are as outlined in the Control Room Manual, Handbook for Returning Officer, Handbook for Presiding Officer and Handbook for Counting Supervisors.
- 73.4. Communications for those Polling Stations and Counting Centres with no cellular or land-line telephone network coverage shall be as per the specific communication plan developed for each Centre by the Department of Elections, Election Commission of Bhutan.
- 73.5. The Dzongkhag Electoral Authorities shall maintain a list of government vehicles in working condition which may be deployed on election duty.
- 73.6. The respective Dzongkhags shall also maintain information of private vehicles, should the need arise for the mobilization of such vehicles.

# 74. Public transport

- 74.1. Public transport arrangements for voters to travel to and from Polling Stations and *Demkhongs* shall be made by the Road Safety and Transport Authority (RSTA) in accordance with *Public Transport for Elections Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan*, 2009.
- 74.2. The RSTA and its officials shall, with cooperation of the Election Security Coordinators and the Dzongkhag Administrations, ensure that for every road head to a Polling Station there is public transport that is safe, economical and operates at regular and predictable schedules.

## **DISPUTE SETTLEMENT**

# 75. Election Disputes and Complaints

- 75.1. An election complaint must:
  - 75.1.1. Indicate a clear case of controversy related to election that is in breach of the Electoral Laws and the grounds for complaint;
  - 75.1.2. Contain material facts;
  - 75.1.3. State the names of the Parties/ Candidates/ individuals against whom the complaint is filed;
  - 75.1.4. Be signed by the petitioner with address and contact details; and
  - 75.1.5. Be in writing.

The prescribed Election Complaint Form is as presented in Annexure 5 (as also referred in point 60.5 of this document).

- 75.2. An election complaint may be lodged to:
  - 75.2.1. Chief Election Commissioner:
  - 75.2.2. Chief Election Coordinator;
  - 75.2.3. An Observer; or
  - 75.2.4. A Returning Officer.
- 75.3. A Returning Officer and Observer shall immediately or at the earliest possible forward any complaint received by him/her to the Chief Election Coordinator.
  - However, in case of an allegation concerning the Chief Election Coordinator, the case must be directly forwarded to the Chief Election Commissioner.
- 75.4. The Central Election Dispute Settlement Body (CEDSB) and a Dzongkhag Election Dispute Settlement Body (DEDSB) in each of the 20 Dzongkhags shall be appointed for the National Assembly Elections 2013.
- 75.5. The functions of the Election Dispute Settlement Bodies are to direct an Investigation Committee for further investigation and verification of the complaint relating to an election; hear investigation report of the Committee and arguments of the Parties and give a reasoned decision; and provide legal advice

- on the issues relating to election dispute as may be referred to by the election officials from time to time.
- 75.6. The Dzongkhag Election Dispute Settlement Body (DEDSB) shall investigate, hear and decide promptly on cases referred to it by the Chief Election Commissioner or the Chief Election Coordinator.
- 75.7. The procedure for investigation, decision and appeal shall be as per the procedures laid down under the *Election Dispute Settlement Rules and Regulations 2013* and the *Election Dispute Settlement Manual*.
- 75.8. The Central Election Dispute Settlement Body (CEDSB) shall investigate, hear and decide on cases of grave nature and any case that could not be resolved at the Dzongkhag level or appealed from thereof.
- 75.9. The Election Dispute Settlement Bodies shall be generally guided by the principles and provisions of the Bhutan Penal Code, Civil and Criminal Procedure Code, Evidence Act and the Electoral Laws and in particular by the Election Dispute Settlement Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2013 and the Manual for the Settlement of Election Disputes, 2013.

## POST-POLL ACTIVITIES

# 76. Storage of EVMs and other Election Materials

- 76.1. The Returning Officer shall ensure that all the used EVMs and Postal Ballots are stored as per procedure for the duration of the Petition Period.
- 76.2. The Returning Officer shall have the overall responsibility to oversee that care is taken by the officers under his/her control in the packing, dispatching, receipt and safe storage of the EVMs used or otherwise at all times.
- 76.3. The security of an EVM shall be given **Top Priority At All Times** and an EVM not left unattended, uncared or left with a person who is not an election official appointed by a competent authority **under any circumstance**.

# 77. Issue of Certificate of Election

77.1. The Election Commission shall issue the Certificate of Election, as in Annexure7, to the successful Candidates in the General Elections on 19<sup>th</sup> of July 2013.

# 78. Relieving Officers from Election Duty

78.1. Election Officers appointed on election duty shall be deemed to have completed their duty once their Relieving Orders are issued.

# 79. Submission of Accounts by Parties and Candidates

- 79.1. A Political Party Representative in each *Demkhong* during the Primary Round and a Candidate in the General Elections must submit weekly accounts of the campaign expenses to the National or Micro Observer for his/her scrutiny and file Election Returns within thirty days of declaration of the Election Result as per the prescribed procedures, regardless of being elected or not, failing which the name of a Political Party may be removed from the Register of Political Parties or a person may be disqualified as a Member holding elective office or Candidate in future elections.
- 79.2. The Public Election Fund Division, supported by the Dzongkhag Electoral Offices, shall receive the Campaign Accounts of the Political Parties within a month from the Primary Round Poll Day and from the Candidates within a month from the General Election Poll Day and accordingly carry out the necessary scrutiny and review of the accounts.

## 80. Submission of Final Report by Observers

80.1. The National Observers shall, besides the Periodic Reports during the Election Period, submit the Final Report for their respective *Demkhongs* to the Election Commission within a week of the completion of the Election Period.

#### FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS

#### 81. Finance and Accounts

81.1. All and any expenditures and rates shall be as per the Government financial rules and regulations, unless expressly stated otherwise under the Electoral Laws.

#### 82. Accounts Officers

- 82.1. Each Dzongkhag Administration shall identify and appoint Accounts Officer(s) to be responsible for managing and keeping the accounts for all expenditures related to the National Assembly Elections 2013 in that Dzongkhag, except for the Public Election Campaign Fund which shall be handled directly by the Public Election Fund Division of the Election Commission.
- 82.2. The Accounts Officer(s) shall be responsible to submit the consolidated accounts to the Election Commission within 15 days of the Declaration of the Election Results.
- 82.3. The finance and expenditure records and accounts shall be maintained in line with the *Guidelines for the Maintenance of Financial Records and Accounts for an Election in the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2013.*

### **Procedure for Online Clearances**

### **Online Security Clearance for Elections**

For a nomination to contest an election in Bhutan and as a part of nomination papers to be filed to a Returning Officer, a candidate will have to provide Security Clearance Certificate specifically issued for election purposes. Security Clearance is now provided as an online service by the Royal Bhutan Police. A candidate is required to visit <a href="http://scs.rbp.gov.bt/status/">http://scs.rbp.gov.bt/status/</a> to apply for Security Clearance. While filing in the online application, choose "Election" from the dropdown menu under the Purpose filed.

Once an application for Security Clearance has been made, status of the application can be tracked, and upon approval by the Royal Bhutan Police the screenshot (webpage) displaying the approved status of the Security Clearance can be printed out and the copy is to be provided to a Returning Officer at the time of submission of nomination papers.

Alternatively, once an application for Security Clearance has been made and approved, a Returning Officer can also directly view the screenshot (webpage) displaying the approved status of the Security Clearance using the CID No. of a candidate.

If print out of the actual Security Clearance Certificate is required, the respective Dzongkhag Election Officers can be contacted.

#### Online Audit Clearance for Elections

For Audit Clearance, a candidate may approach the concerned Dzongkhag Election Officer who will initiate the process of applying the Audit Clearance through the designated Dzongkhag Administration's operator of the online Audit Clearance system.

Once the application has been approved, the designated operator of the online Audit Clearance system will provide the print out copy which must be submitted at the time of submission of nomination papers.


